# 15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

University Grants Commission proposed the New Education Policy toall the higher institutions and proposed to implement from the nextacademic year. Accordingly, the state government and Universities are in the positive mood to implement in all the affiliated collegescome under their domain. As per New Education Policy, a multidisciplinary and holistic approach in education is

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sought in our institution which is instrumental in developing integrated individuals. It is a ground-breaking move as it helps the students to learn sciences, technologies, mathematics with liberal arts, humanities, languages, social sciences, professional skills, vocational skills, ethics, morality, human values and so on at thesame time. This integrated approach can make students more marketable in today's workforce. It improves problem-solving skills and sparks creativity as well as innovation. This framework helps the students to develop character traits such as perseverance, responsibility, and citizenship that will serve them well throughout their life. The policy is laying emphasis on the flexible and innovative curricula of all higher education institutions to include credit-based courses and projects in the areas of community engagement and service, environmental education, and value-based education towards the attainment of holistic and multidisciplinary education. Our college is a multifaculty institute having faculty of Humanities, Commerce & Management, Science & technology The institute has been offering the major Science courses (Physical, Chemical, Life Lifes Computer Sciences), Humanities (Literature, Political Science, History, Geography Economics, various subjects under Commerce & Management, in UG and PG degree programmes. In view of the transformations envisioned in NEP, respective adaptations of the existing programs and courses will be reorganized by specially

constituted committee.

As UGC directed to all the higher education institutions to implement New Education Policy and its core components, institution ran the campaign of Academic bank of Credit though which most of the students of our institution have enrolled on the Academic Bank of Credits portal. The same information is forwarded to University for the further procedure. The Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) would provide digital platform for the students for credit recognition, credit accumulation, credit transfers, and credit redemption. The initiative undertaken by the affiliating University is at preparatory phase. The institute would register for the ABC in near future.

### 17.Skill development:

The affiliating university initiated the implementation of learning outcome based curriculum framework for the UG programme which is consistent with the objectives of NEP for fostering quality education. It includes the translation of academic

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research into innovations for practical use to socio-economical development. Involvement of public and private sector investment in higher education will develop alternative learning modes such as open and distance learning modes. Introduction of the MOOCs will help students to develop their skills. By introducing the Project work, summer training programmes, internship and industrial training programmes, the bench skills of the students will be enhanced. Vocational education will be integrated in the educational offerings of all higher education institutions in a phased manner over the next decade. The development of vocational capacities will go hand-in-hand with the development of 'academic' or other capacities. Besides traditinal courses, institution intends to start few vocational courses in order to develop employbility skill among students. With the help of traditional as well as few new courses, Institution offers Valuebased education to inculcatepositivity amongst the learner that include the development of humanistic, ethical, Constitutional, and universal human values of truth (satya), righteous conduct (dharma), peace (shanti), love(prem), nonviolence (ahimsa), scientific temper, citizenship values, and also life-skills etc.

# 18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Indian Knowledge System encompasses the Foundational knowledge, Science, Engineering & Technology, Humanities and Social Sciencesthrough a structured classification. The curriculum designed by University according to the guidelines given by University Grants Commission , is suitable that would ensure education is relatable, relevant, interesting, and effective for our students. It will also lead to strong identity formation as the young generation would be well versed with the rich culture and heritage of India and can take pride in it. Online Courses run by SWAYAM portal is fully adopted by institution for faculty members as well as for students. Teachers are encouraged to prepare subject material and to translate vocational courses and value-added online courses into the regional language. Teachers are suggested to write scientific articles in the local newspapers and deliver popular science lectures in the regional languages. The courses will be designed for the promotion and improvement of local skills in the local language. The regional and local arts and crafts are promoted through entrepreneurship cell of the college. Some parts of syllabi of the subjects like Botany, Chemistry. Social Sciences and Literatures are based on traditional and ancient aspect to promote regional knowledge and culture.

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### 19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Outcome-based education focuses on results rather than learning processes. Here in our institution, Students are given clear objectives and regular evaluations of progress, and they receive personalized feedback on how well they have achieved those goals. The key to success in outcome-based education is clarity, for both teachers and students to understand what's expected of them. Outcome-based education aims to create a clear expectation of results that students must achieve. Here, the outcome includes skills, knowledge and attitude. In addition to understanding what's expected, outcome-based education also encourages transparency. The basic principle of outcome-based education is that students must meet a specific standard to graduate. Hence, no curve grading isused in outcome-based education, and instead, teachers are free to experiment with any methodology they feel is best. New Education Policy (NEP-2020) has focused on experiential, application-based learning and research based internship in the stream of Science, Technology, Engineering, Art & Design, and Mathematics (STEAM). As a part of holistic and all encompassing education, students will be given internship opportunities in local industries and businesses. Local communities as well as research internships will improve students' employability. Ph.D. students and faculty members are encouraged to undertake high quality outcome-based research so as to produce Intellectual Property (Patents and Copyrights). Students are encouraged to participate in various Aavishkar, Science Fairs, Innovation, Competition, etc. for exploring the practical side of their learning and promoting innovation among students.

### **20.Distance education/online education:**

Institution intends to start online vocational courses in Computer Science and Chemistry subjects. Since COVID-19 period, faculty members as well as students have been acquinted with online education as they used online mode of education. Few online teaching softwares are used for the effective teaching learning process. However blended learning is practised in the instution by all faculty members. NEP emphasized distance education / online education which expand the access to education and training for employed students. Since its' flexible schedule reduce the effects of the time constraints imposed by personal responsibilities and commitment. The Institute has already started working on these aspects. The ICT based facilities are created for imparting online education. Teachers are encouraged to create online add-on and skill based courses. Teachers are

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suggested to develop econtent and online teaching material. To cope up with the advanced teaching skills and to understand current online teaching trends, teachers are motivated to participate in advanced pedagogy training programs. Students and Teachers are registered and completed SWAYAM and NPTEL courses. Institute planned to start other skill development courses through online mode.

The faculty analyses the needs of the students before the commencement of every semester and plans the curriculum as prescribed by the University in such a way that it includes different activities related to the designed syllabus. At the beginning of every semester, the head of every

department submits a workload statement, over which the general time-table is prepared. Accordingly, each department prepares its own teaching plan allotting term-wise topics to be taught within

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the stipulated time. The examination results are reviewed and the weaker students are taught again in remedial classes. Teachers put in all efforts to ensure quality and enhance academic growth. Practical, theoretical & oral examinations are conducted to judge the understanding of the students. The new examination pattern introduced by affiliating university is being strictly adopted by the college. The effective delivery of the curriculum includes a wide variety of steps like work culture, supervision and revision through periodic meetings with the principal, faculty and students.

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

The College encourages student-centric learning through various methods such as brain storming group discussions, quiz competitions, presentations and project work in participative learning and problem solving methodologies. Regular participative activities viz., group discussions, projects, field visits, educational tours, seminars, guest lectures are organized in the college and the students actively participate in these activities within and outside the college. Students are given individual projects and class assignments for focusing on self-study and to encourage independent learning. Different student support systems are available in the college like Library, Computer Lab, Reading Room, ICT basedclassrooms (Smart Classrooms). 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substantial number of dustbins are installed. Most of the waste collected is biodegradable. The minimal amount of non-biodegradable is mostly burnt in pits. The biodegradable portion too is dumped in pits for decomposition over time. The solid biodegradable waste collected from the parks, play field after use of lawn mower and bush cutter is collected and dumped for decomposition to be used as a source of bio fertilizer. During the autumn season a large quantity of fallen dry leaves are collected and dumped to decompose for manure.

Liquid waste: All the liquid waste from washroom, bathroom is collected into soakage pits through systematic drainage. Zero percent leakage of waste water is ensured.
